The building is located on the former site of the Phillips Seafood Headquarters, built in 1920. This existing facility infrastructure also qualified as a brownfield site, and its remediation by MAIF restored not only the water quality of the area but it also



mitigated potential health risks for the surrounding community.

MAIF has made an effort to improve energy efficiency and 100% of appliances in the space are ENERGY STAR rated. Enhanced commissioning was also completed to ensure that all building systems operate as they are designed to..
